

## Resnagging in the Murray River: Hume Dam to Yarrowonga Invitation to project launch

You are invited to attend the official launch of *Resnagging in the Murray River: Hume Dam to Yarrowonga* project funded through The Living Murray – the biggest of its kind ever undertaken in Australia.

**When:** 11.30 am, Friday 18 August 2006. Lunch will be provided.

**Where:** The launch will be held at the Warrawidgee property near Corowa. See map on page 2.

**Transport:** Meet at 11am at Rowers Park in Corowa to board a shuttle bus taking participants to venue. Attendees are asked to park their cars at Rowers Park (off Bridge Street, under John Ford Bridge) in Corowa, as there is no parking on site.

The bus will be running between Corowa and Warrawidgee from 11am, and will return to Rowers Park by 2pm.

The launch is the official start of works to rehabilitate native fish habitat (instream woody habitat or snags) in key sections of the River Murray.

At the event, you will receive information about rehabilitation activities; the location of key resnagging sites; onground work methods and native fish monitoring.

Snags and resnagging equipment will be available for viewing.

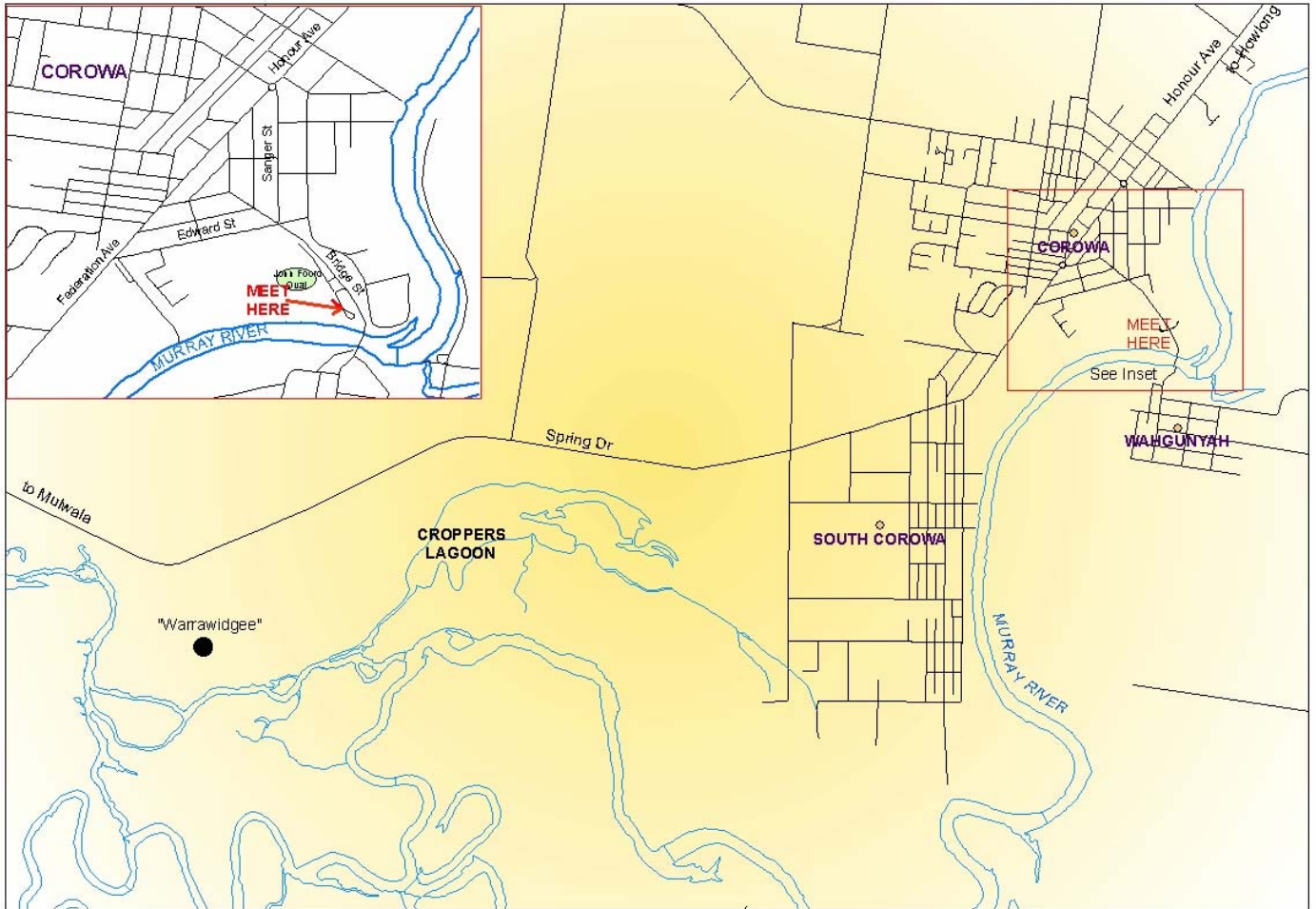
