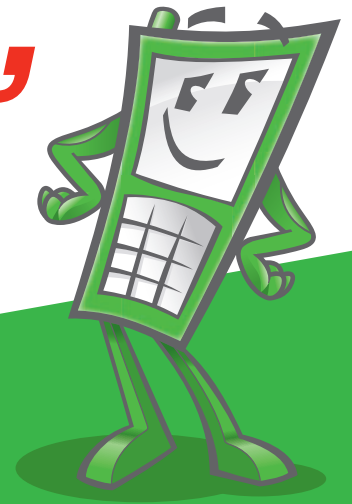


# "I can do that!"

## National Schools Recycling Challenge



### Rewards

#### Bandicoot Habitats

For every 30kg of mobile phones that are collected, we aim to restore one bandicoot's habitat through Landcare Australia. To find out more about bandicoots and their habitat requirements, go to the website [www.mobilemuster.com.au](http://www.mobilemuster.com.au)

#### Student Rewards

Honour rolls will be distributed to each school in your challenge pack upon receiving your school's registration.

**The student who collects the most phones within their school, as recorded on the school honour roll, will receive a school champion certificate.**

**The student who collects the most phones in each state will win a Book Pack to the value of \$100.**

**The national winner will receive a Family Experience Pack to the value of \$250. Details on how to enter will be provided in your challenge pack.**

#### School Rewards

Collect 8kgs or more and your school will receive 10 brilliant Milton Mobile & Billie Bandicoot Reward Packs that can be distributed to the top 10 collecting students in your school.

The honour roll supplied in your challenge pack can be used to record student collections.

**The school that collects the highest weight nationally will also be recognised with a prize.**

Did you know that there were eleven species of bandicoots found in Australia, but three are now extinct and another three are highly endangered!

**MobileMuster has joined with Landcare Australia and for every 30kg of recycled mobile phones and accessories collected, \$100 will be donated to Landcare Australia to help to restore a bandicoot's habitat.**

**This will include tree planting and predator proof fencing, as well as creating community awareness.**

**"I can do that!" I can help save the bandicoot from extinction!**

The challenge is to collect 3,000kgs nationally of mobile phones and accessories by the end of National Recycling Week. If schools can achieve that, then together we can help to restore the habitat of approximately **100 bandicoots!**

The challenge is simple – muster up old mobile phones, their batteries, chargers and accessories before National Recycling Week (9-15 November 2009). You will be helping the environment and Landcare Australia to save the bandicoot at the same time!

#### How Does the Challenge Work?

It's simple to run a muster, here's what to do:

1. Register your school to run a Muster.
2. MobileMuster will send out a Challenge Pack which includes posters, teaching resources and activities. Set up a collection point in the school for the duration of the challenge and ask students to round up old mobile phones, batteries, chargers and accessories.
3. Place all items collected into the collection box provided by Friday 13th November 2009 and call MobileMuster to organise a free pick-up.

#### Are You Ready to Accept the Challenge?

Simply register your school by completing the fax back form or online at [www.mobilemuster.com.au](http://www.mobilemuster.com.au). Your challenge pack will then be mailed to you. Registrations close Friday 9th October 2009. Challenge concludes Friday 13th November 2009. Pick ups must be booked by 3pm Friday 20th November 2009.
